Gainsborough Road Toilets

The toilets were opened on 26th September, 2011 up to 5.30pm (daily) and are monitored on a regular basis. An initial charge of 20p per usage has been imposed (excluding radar keyholders for the disabled toilets), although this can be reviewed on a regular basis.

Bawtry Library
